- Veteran's Benefits: Dated letter from agency indicating loss of coverage; copy of card issued or letter from agency showing future coverage start date
- Peace Corps: Dated letter from agency indicating loss of coverage; copy of card issued or letter from agency showing future coverage start date
- Health Insurance Cards with coverage dates
- Insurance Company Letter with coverage dates
- Statement of health benefits with coverage dates
- Health Insurance letter, including coverage termination dates

### **Incarceration**

- Release paperwork
- Documentation providing custody status as 'released' or providing release date
- Current income documentation (see income section)

- Signed letter from Broker, Navigator, Assister, or Community Designated Organization (such as hospital, re-entry organization, with photo ID)
